David Nazarewicz - she was a giver - since we both were coffee lovers, we shared coffee and she showed me how to use her old fashioned coffee percolator when we lived at Pitkin Ave. She saw me shining my Army boots before I started my second tour of duty and said "oh, so that's how you do it."

- Canasta with the Golden Girls Grandma Green, Aunt Doris and my mom Patty Andrews.
- When I was on terminal leave from active duty army before transitioning into the Ohio National Guard. I had about 30 days annual leave or vacation time that I spent with The Golden Girls from mid December to mid January.
- The Doctor Who Scarf. Is the handywork of he Golden Girls that had their hand in making this scarf possible. Grandma Green was the main crocheter, while aunt Doris would come back and forth with the scarf and asked if it would be need to be longer. Mom paid a dear price and had all the patches put on the scarf that resemble my time that I served with the Navigators.
- What stands out the most during that Christmas time season in the 98 99 year is that my youngest daughter Nicole wanted a specific doll house for Christmas. It was made of a type of balsa wood if I remember correctly, I assembled the main house with detail and painted it whereas because of time constraints to make it by the Christmas deadline, Aunt Doris painted and decorated all the furniture that went into the doll house. And with the finishing touch, Grandma Green in her old age painted two shingles which I had initialed for her to attach to Nicole's doll house.
- So as a veteran soldier, that brings me to Doris May (Green) Colbert's faith. It was evident of her faith, just about every meeting that I was with her. I recall once maybe twice that Aunt Doris played the "Deck of Cards" on the 45 record that equated to her faith and goes something like this...

During the North African campaign, a bunch of soldier boys had Been on a long hike and they arrived in a little town called Casino. The Next morning being Sunday, several of the boys went to Church. A sergeant Commanded the boys in Church and after the Chaplain had read the prayer, The text was taken up next. Those of the boys who had a prayer book took Them out, but this one boy had only a deck of cards, and so he spread Them out. The Sergeant saw the cards and said, "Soldier, put away those Cards." After the services was over, the soldier was taken prisoner and Brought before the Provost Marshall.

The Marshall said, "Sergeant, why have you brought this man Here?" "For playing cards in church, Sir." "And what have you to say for Yourself, son?" "Much, Sir," replied the soldier. The Marshall said, "I Hope so, for if not I shall punish you more than any man was ever Punished." The soldier said, "Sir, I have been on the march for about six Days. I have neither a Bible nor a prayer book, but I hope to satisfy You, Sir, with the purity of my intentions." And with that, the boy Started his story:

"You see Sir, when I look at the Ace, it reminds me that there Is but one God. And the Deuce reminds me that the Bible is divided into Two parts, the Old and the New Testaments. When I see the Trey, I think Of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. And when I see the Four, I Think of the four Evangelists who preached the Gospel; there was Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. And when I see the Five, it reminds me of the five Wise virgins who trimmed their lamps; there were ten of them: five were Wise and were saved, five were foolish and were shut out. When I see the Six, it reminds me that in six days, God made this great heaven and Earth. When I see the Seven, it reminds me that on the seventh day, God Rested from His great work. And when I see the Eight, I think of the Eight righteous persons God saved when He destroyed this earth; there was Noah, his wife, their sons and their wives. And when I see the Nine, I Think of the lepers our Savior cleansed, and nine out of the ten didn't Even thank Him. When I see the Ten, I think of the Ten Commandments God Handed down to Moses on a table of stone. When I see the King, it Reminds me that there is but one King of Heaven, God Almighty. And when I See the Queen, I think of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who is Queen of Heaven. And the Jack or Knave is the Devil. When I count the number Of spots on a deck of cards, I find 365, the number of days in a year. There are 52 cards, the number of weeks in a year. There are 4 suits, the Number of weeks in a month. There are 12 picture cards, the number of Months in a year. There are 13 tricks, the number of weeks in a quarter. So you see, Sir, my pack of cards serves me as a Bible, an Almanac and a Prayer Book."

"And friends, the story is true. I know, I was that soldier."

This is a great song by the late Tex Ritter. (January 12, 1905 January 2, 1974) In 1948, "Rye Whiskey" and his cover of "The Deck of Cards" both made the top ten. Ritter was married to actress Dorothy Fay from June 14, 1941, until his death. The couple had two sons, Thomas Ritter and television actor **John Ritter**. Ritter was married to actress Dorothy Fay from June 14, 1941, until his death. Ritter had his last recording session for Capitol Records in 1973. His last song, "The Americans," became a posthumous hit shortly after his death. In 1974, he had a heart attack and died in Nashville.

Deck of Cards https://bible.org/object-lesson-deck-cards

- The Ace reminds us that there is only one God.
- The Two represents the two parts of the Bible, Old and New Testaments
- The Three represents the Father, Son, and the Holy Ghost.
- The Four represents the Four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- The Five is for the five virgins. There were ten but only five of them were glorified (Matthew 25:1-13).
- The Six is for the six days it took God to create the Heavens and Earth (Genesis 1).
- The Seven is for the day God rested after making His Creation (Genesis 2:3).
- The Eight is for the family of Noah and his wife, their three sons and their wives -- the eight people God spared from the flood that destroyed the Earth (Genesis 7:7).
- The Nine is for the lepers that Jesus cleansed of leprosy He cleansed ten, but nine never thanked Him (Luke 17:11-19).
- The Ten represents the Ten Commandments that God handed down to Moses on tablets made of stone (Exodus 20:1-21).
- The Jack is a reminder of Satan, one of God's first angels, but he got kicked out of heaven for his sly and wicked ways and is now the joker of eternal hell (Ezekiel 28:11-19).
- The Queen represents Mary, mother of Jesus (Luke 1:26-38).
- The King stands for Jesus, for he is the King of all kings (Revelation 19:16).
- When I count the dots on all the cards, I come up with a total of 365, one for every day of the year.
- There are a total of 52 cards in a deck; each is a week 52 weeks in a year.
- The four suits represent the four seasons: spring, summer, fall and winter.
- Each suit has thirteen cards -- there are exactly thirteen weeks in a quarter.
- When you want to thank God, I just pull out a deck of cards and am reminded of all that we have to be thankful for.
- As you can see what was important to Doris Colbert and her appreciation was for Jesus
- The greatest gamble is not with a deck of cards but for you to stop fighting yourself and prove out a total surrender daily to the Jesus who willing died for you.
